question, March 20th, 2008, Mr. Mendell walked out of his cottage, closed the gate of the house, shut the gate, and heard the sliding glass door open and saw a person I will use the term "shooter" to describe the suspect in the case.

The shooter walked out of the sliding glass door. Mr. Mendell actually looked at him for a few seconds before the shooter noticed Mr. Mendell.

Mr. Mendell said he paid attention to the shooter's face; that the shooter then looked up, saw Mr. Mendell. They were face-to-face with each other.

The shooter began walking briskly or purposely or aggressively towards Mr. Mendell.

Mr. Mendell was looking him in the face during this time period.

Mr. Mendell, the shooter pulled out a gun from some unknown place, walked directly up to Mr. Mendell, stood within one foot of Mr. Mendell and placed the gun near or waived it around the vicinity of his head placing the barrel of the gun within an inch Mr. Mendell's head.

The shooter was screaming "where is Sam Rhoads"' multiple times, approximately seven times.

Mr. Mendell was saying, "I don't know I don't know".

Mr. Mendell got down-on-his knees and was

begging not to be hurt or shot, and was kind of wiggling around hoping to avoid the gun.

During this time period he said at the interview portion that he was unable to see the defendant -- excuse me, unable to see the shooter out of the corner of his eye.

At the preliminary hearing he said he was not able to see the shooter during this time period.

The shooter then fired a round-that, obviously, did not hit Mr. Mendell for reasons unknown, either he missed or the gun misfired. In any event, Mr. Mendell begged for his life.

The shooter demanded money from Mr. Mendell.

Mr. Mendell got up and walked towards his cottage. At that time having his back toward the shooter, went into the cottage and asked his girlfriend to get his wallet. And when he looked back out the door the shooter was standing outside the door of his Cottage. The girlfriend was in the cottage with him and in view of the shooter, apparently. And although Mr. Mendell was not focusing on his face at that time, he saw him standing here. When he got the money and turned around to hand it to the shooter the shooter was gone.
