- A. It's hard to look at.
- Q. Why is it hard to look at it; what is hard to look at?
 - A The chin mouth and the nose.
- Q. When you say the chin, the mouth and the nose, are you talking about the chin, the mouth and the nose on the person on People's 12-D?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. Why is it hard to look at the chin, the mouth, and the nose of that person?
- A. Because it looks like the chin; the mouth, and the nose of the person I saw.
 - Q. Does that look different than the chin and the mouth and the nose of the person in People's 9-M-8 through 13?
 - A. Yes, in some of the pictures -- some of it doesn't -- it looks a little more -- looks like pictures, and some of them look like the person who was there that day also.
