A. I've been there every day for the last
since Friday. I had the accident Friday, so I haven'
been going to work. I've just been hanging out. My
girlfriend's in town for spring break, so she's been
there every second of the time.

I don't know. We just woke up. She heard it first, I think. It was just -- it sounded like almost metal banging or something. It's hard to say what we -- I actually heard because the TV was on and she muted the TV. And then I think I heard at least three or four gunshots. That's what they were. I didn't know that at the time. I thought it was just somebody banging around something.

She went up and looked through the blinds and saw that the back gate was open, and I said, "Oh, crap.

That's bad." The back gate can't be left open because Abby will get out, the dog. Because people leave it open sometimes. I said, "I'll take care of it." I kind of sprung out of bed -- because I was like, "What's that noise? What's going on?" I was like, "What's going on here?"

I thought Josh was screwing around with something.

I was going to go talk to him. Because he was always

working on stuff. I opened my door. I walked out. I

saw the garage -- the back garage door was open also. So I was like, Oh, maybe Josh is working in there or something.

The house is always -- basically almost always unlocked. Everything's unlocked. She started locking it recently when -- six months ago -- maybe four months ago there was another incident. It was probably the same guy. Throwing a rock through the front window. Throwing a rock through her back window. She's always afraid of this guy. He's, I think, made numerous threats to her and stuff. She's in a lawsuit with the father of the guy.

So basically I saw the two doors open. I got out of bed in a robe. There was just -- you know, I was in my boxers, so I put on a robe, walked to the gate. I walked -- there's grass and then there's a cement path that goes around that, and the house kind of goes like this. So I was walking on the cement path. I got to where the rear sliding window was, kind of turned right, and I was right in front of where the BBQ grill would be there.

And he walked out of the back sliding window, which -- where his -- Sam's room is. I'm guessing that's where he went into. It's hard to remember. I looked at him and I -- I think I may have even said,



"Who the hell are you," or something like that. 1 2 Basically just looked at him. And then he started walking towards me and I was like, What's going on? 3 4 didn't know. 5 I kind of, actually, put up my guard because I was like, I'm going to tackle this guy. I don't know who 6 the hell this is. He kind of came over to me and --7 8 "Where's Sam? Where's Sam Rhoads? Where's Sam Rhoads?" Just kept repeating it nonstop. 9 I said, "Who are you?" He pulled out his gun. 10 Ι 11 think it might have been behind his trench coat. didn't see it before then. I think at that time I 12 said, "Whatever you want" -- I was backing up. I said, 1.3 "Whatever you want. I'll give you anything you want. 14 Don't hurt me. 15 Whatever you want. I'll give it to you. You want it? I'll give it to you." 16 He said, "Where's Sam?" "Where's Sam, he kept 17 18 saying. 19 I said, "I don't know. Inside. I don't know. Ι 20 don't know where she is. I don't know. I don't know. 21 I don't know." And he put the gun to my head -- I think I got on 22 my knees, kind of put my hands up, I guess, and said, 23 "Don't" -- whatever. Whatever. And I was squirming 24 25 around and I think I kind of squirmed my head around



and he shot and missed. He shot the gun. My -- this ear. So I think it was this ear. I can't even remember, but my ear -- I couldn't hear after he shot. It was hard to hear.

I didn't know if it was a pellet gun. I didn't know if it was a real gun. I didn't hear any ricochet. I didn't hear anything. Immediately after I got shot I thought I had got shot in the head. I didn't know what was going on.

I didn't even know -- I kind of did that whole thing. Okay. And he's like, "Give me your money."

I said, "No problem. I'll give you whatever you want." I was like, "Open up my door." I was basically inviting him in to take whatever he wanted. I said -- Mari- -- yelled, "Mariele, give me my wallet. Give me my wallet." I think he was close to that door at the time, and he just disappeared. I don't know where he went. I didn't see him. I came back outside with money, and he was gone. I didn't see him anywhere. I didn't go anywhere. I was just standing next to my door looking around me.

I said, What the hell am I doing? Ran into my room. Locked my door. Told her to get away from all the windows. Told her to get in my closet, because I have a closet. I have so much shit in there. I just,



kind of, managed to crawl my way in there. Closed the door and she started crying, and we were kind of freaking out.

She's like, "We need to" -- when I came in and asked for my wallet she's like, "Call 911. Call 911." At that time I didn't want to because I didn't know where. I thought he was right there. I didn't want to -- I was afraid he was going to kill me. I didn't want to make any, you know, any sudden movements or anything.

Got in the closet. Was in the closet for, maybe, two minutes. Realized, Oh, crap. I have to call 911. I don't know what's going on. Got out. Realized my door was locked. Told her and I to lien against the door in case he tried to break the door in or something he couldn't get in.

At that point I called 911. I was in my room.

The dis- -- I was on the phone with the dispatcher.

They put me through to, I guess, your local department because they transferred me or something. And I just kind of freaked out over the phone. I tried to stay as calm as I could. I just said, "He tried to shoot at me. He's got a gun. I don't know if it's a cap gun. I don't know if it's going on."

1 She said, "Is he still there?"

I said, "I don't know." And things basically went from there.

I stayed on the phone. I didn't know if police were there or what. I kept asking her. "Are they here? I mean, am I safe to walk out?" I instructed the officer -- I held my girlfriend's hand. They told me to walk towards the sliding glass door. I opened the sliding glass door. I went through the house. I opened the front door, and then there you guys were.

And then, obviously, I heard a bunch of times -"I can't see. I can't see. I can't see." We just
walked out with our hands, and then you guys did it
from there.

DETECTIVE JOWER: Okay. Can I borrow a big piece of paper from you, please?

DETECTIVE REESE: Sure.

DETECTIVE JOWER: I'm going to --

THE WITNESS: I smelled -- when I walked into the house -- when I opened the sliding glass door I smelled gun power. It smelled like a cap gun. I mean, it just smelled like gun power. I mean, I'm sure they all smell the same. I didn't go anywhere. I was -- my -- automatic everything -- when the guy was holding the



gun to my head too, I knew where Sam was. I wasn't going to tell him. I didn't want -- I didn't want him to know. I'm sure he already knew. He was already in the house firing the shots off. He knew exactly where she was. Unless she heard something -- I don't know what happened. I don't know -- he probably confronted Josh first. Josh said something. She locked herself in the -- I don't know. I don't know what happened, but I didn't want to tell him.

And then after he shot I was pretty much desperate for anything. And then at that point he was just like, "Give me your money."

And I'm like, "I don't have any money. I have a little bit of money. I'll give you my wallet. I'll give you" -- "help yourself. Take whatever you want."

When I was in the backyard too, I should add, I asked Mariele when I was in the backyard, I said, "Do you know how to hop a fence?" I was going to jump over -- if she wasn't there, I would have jumped over the neighbor's fence and ran as fast as I could and as far as I could.

After he shot me I contemplated attacking him because I figured it was a fake gun because I think he basically shot me right in the head. I don't know if he moved it at the last minute. I was moving. I mean,



it just happened so fast. That was my only thought.

Like, this guy is -- I don't know. I know it sounds

funny, but I kind of sized him up and I was like, I'm

going to do whatever I can, you know. But he was so -
he was so nervous. He was not a professional at this.

He had no idea what he was doing. He was trying to

reload his gun after he had shot me and fumbling around

all over the place.

I saw the -- when he pulled it back -- or after he

I saw the -- when he pulled it back -- or after he shot me, pulled it back when he was trying to reload it and his hands were shaking. It looked to have two -- two barrels. It was a handgun maybe the size of this paper. And I don't think he was wearing gloves, so I don't know.

He was wearing a black beanie. Looked like it was a long beanie, but he had rolled it up so it was like a hat on him. Sunglasses. From what I remember just a black trench coat and -- I'm trying to think of what else. I think that's about it. Thank God my girlfriend didn't go out there.

- Q. Do you have --
- A. I'm still curious -- the most curious thing I am is if he had a real gun --

DETECTIVE JOWER: Okay. I need a Sharpie.

DETECTIVE REESE: Sharpie?

You described it as a handgun 3 4 with two barrels. 5 THE WITNESS: I think it had two barrels. might have been, like, one longer one and one shorter 6 7 one on the bottom. I remember him, like, cocking it back and you could actually see the barrels itself. 8 9 And --10 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. What color was it? 11 THE WITNESS: Black. 12 DETECTIVE REESE: Black. All right. And you 13 mentioned him fidgeting like he was reloading it. 14 He was trying to reload it for sure. THE WITNESS: 15 DETECTIVE REESE: Why do you say that? 16 he doing to make you think --THE WITNESS: He was -- he had the barrel back and 17 it looked like he was trying to shove something in it. 18 He was scrummaging around, and he was definitely trying 19 20 to reload the qun. 21 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. Are you familiar with 22 handguns at all? 23 THE WITNESS: No. 24 DETECTIVE REESE: No. Okay. Do you know the



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difference between a revolver and a -- like, a

1 semi-automatic? 2 THE WITNESS: If I saw pictures, I'd know. That's about it. 3 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. Like a revolver has the 4 5 chamber in the center. 6 THE WITNESS: It's not a revolver. 7 DETECTIVE REESE: It's not a revolver. THE WITNESS: So he pulled back the side. 8 9 For sure. 10 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. And when you say reloading, he was reloading it from the top of the --11 12 THE WITNESS: Yeah. 13 DETECTIVE REESE: Did you actually ever see any 14 type of bullets? 15 THE WITNESS: Nope. 16 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. THE WITNESS: I -- either a pellet gun or blanks. 17 He had to be -- I think -- I don't know. I'm thinking 18 19 he's shooting blanks or he got a bad bullet or 20 something because he shot -- if he didn't shoot me in the head, he shot an inch away, and I thought I would 21 22 have heard a ricochet or something. DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. You want to do this real 23 24 fast?



DETECTIVE JOWER:

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Yeah.

1 DETECTIVE REESE: Will you give us consent to 2 search your --3 THE WITNESS: Of course. 4 DETECTIVE REESE: -- house to make sure he's not in there? 5 THE WITNESS: Of course. 6 7 DETECTIVE REESE: Okay. 4	actually looked out the front door or if when she

1	A. Josh's mom's. Sam's dog.
2	Q. Sam's dog?
3	A. Yeah.
4	Q. What kind of dog is it?
5	A. A miniature Yorkie. That's what the officers
6	should be more afraid of. That thing's mean.
7	Q. So miniature he was running around?
8	A. Not running. Still. I looked and the dog was
9	just sitting there, which is very rare because that
10	dog I don't even know if that dog I don't know if
11	he shot the dog. It was alive at that point. I heard

13	Q. Okay. So before lying in bed, heard dog

Mariele's has (unintelligible), and my doctor asked me if I wanted pain medicine. I'm not for any of 10 11 I'm completely against it. that stuff. What was the last time you drank any alcohol? 12 Q. 13 Α. Last night. 14 Ο. What time last night? 15 Α. 10:30 at night. 16 Ο. How much? 17 Α. Two glasses of wine. 18 Ο. That's it? 19 Α. Yup. 20 And you are not -- you didn't feel the effects Q. of the alcohol? I know that's a silly question. 21 22 You're a --23 I understand. I mean, I had been up since 24 8:30, 9:00. I got up at 9:00 o'clock in the morning to



do work.

1	Q. Okay. You said that you could possibly
2	identify a gun if if we did a gun photo lineup of
3	guns
4	A. I think I would be able to, yes.
5	Q. Do we have pictures of guns?
6	DETECTIVE REESE: We might.
7	BY DETECTIVE JOWER:
8	Q. Okay. We'll definitely do a photo line up of
9	guns. Okay?
10	A. I know it sounds funny, but it just looked
11	almost like the guns that normal police officers carry.
12	It wasn't loud. It was weird. It didn't sound like
13	I was just thinking it was a fake gun because when it
14	went off it didn't sound like it was a and I looked
15	at it and there was no silencer or anything like that.

5	we should go in the closet.
6	Q. You locked the closet right here?
7	A. Yes.
8	Q. In your house. Okay. Waited ten minutes.
9	Back in
10	A. The whole time Mariele's saying, "Call the
11	police. Call the police. Call 911."
12	Q. Hid in closet. So
13	A. I told her when we first came in and when I,
14	kind of, went out I don't know if I actually came
15	out to give him the money or I just looked and I didn't
16	see him and I closed the door and locked the door. I
17	said, "Get under the bed. Let's hide under the bed.
18	Let's get under the bed."
19	DETECTIVE REESE: Quick question. Is there any
20	other way into the backyard except that gate there?
21	THE WITNESS: There's the side of the house
22	here, but the gate doesn't open.
23	BY DETECTIVE JOWER:
24	Q. So you waited ten minutes?
25	A. Besides going through, you know, the house

3	Q. Waited ten minutes?

23	a contractor
24	DETECTIVE REESE: When you say "scuffle," not a



physical scuffle.

THE WITNESS: No. No. Not at all.

DETECTIVE REESE: Okay.

THE WITNESS: Probably just an argument over the phone. Hey, I'm going to hire another contractor. I need this done. Or he just -- actually, I think he just stopped contact completely from her. Just took the easy way out. The guy's a real -- not a good guy.

So, anyway, Nathan was working on the house at the time running the electrical -- from what I'm told -- for the house. He's not in any way -- he was -- she was told he was an electrical contractor. He doesn't have any licenses. He's just a hobo that knows how to run wires.
