STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ms. Rhoads screamed and ran towards the laundry room. Joshua Rhoads heard the scream and came out into the hallway where he confronted the defendant. Joshua told the defendant to get out of the house. The defendant said nothing, and immediately sprayed Joshua with pepper spray. The defendant then attempted to grab Ms. Rhoads, but she and Joshua were able to run into the laundry room. Joshua pushed the laundry room door shut to prevent the defendant from entering.

The defendant began shooting his gun through the laundry room door. The defendant then began breaking the door. The laundry room door broke in half and Ms. Rhoads saw the defendant reach through the broken door and shoot her son.

The defendant then exited the rear of the residence and confronted the Mr. Mendell. The defendant pointed his gun at Mr. Mendell's head and repeatedly demanded, "Where is Sam Rhoads?". The defendant then fired again, missing Mr. Mendell. Mr. Mendell saw the defendant fiddling with the gun which appeared to be
